From the minister...

Thank you for all of your emails and phone calls regarding the guestion I asked you last week, namely, "If church reopened for Sunday worship, would you come?" It's been very useful to look through all your thoughts and reflections, hopes and fears, confidences and insecurities. It helps us plan together for the future.

I have to say that overwhelmingly you are telling me that you have reservations about attending a church service at the present time. There are two main reasons for this:

- Some of you, particularly those in vulnerable categories, feel that it is still too early to consider returning to public worship
- Many of you seem to be of the opinion that under the current restrictions and guidelines, you wouldn't enjoy the experience of church whilst wearing a mask, not being allowed to sing, and not being allowed the time to properly fellowship with one another

Those of you who normally come to church as a family, with children, are guite understandably wary about how church under the current restrictions would work with young ones. We are looking at what the options might be for this and would value your parental input on it.

But despite all of these reservations, everyone is saying how much they miss church, and how much they are looking forward to returning when the time is right and the lockdown restrictions have been eased a little more. And I feel the same. It's all very well having online services, but it's no substitute for all being together as a fellowship, singing and praying together. Plus, of course, not everyone is able to join in online for various reasons. I look forward to soon being able to welcome you back to church, and I will keep you posted with every new development. There are plans afoot to make this happen.

In the meantime, look after yourselves, keep praying for everyone, and stand firm in the faith!


What's happening with Messy Church?
