I just wanted to say thank you again for your love and support during my time as your minister. I held my final service in the circuit on Sunday 25th July at Trinity, and they presented me with a wonderful gift which I know is a gift from St Paul's as well. Thank you for contributing to this, it's awesome!



Here's a photo of the new chair in case you haven't seen it. There is a back story to this.

From 1993 – 96 I was training for the Methodist ministry at Lincoln theological college, and I was provided with a study room in the old Victorian college building which contained a desk and a chair, both of which were pretty old and battered. When I finished my degree course the old college building was set to close; I'd become quite fond of the chair (I'd spent enough hours sitting in it reading

difficult theological books!) so, when I heard that all the old furniture was destined to be thrown away, I decided to "liberate" my study chair and take it with me. It was first made in the 1930s, so by now it was almost completely wrecked.

It's been with me ever since, through 25 years of ministry - until someone had the bright idea of "liberating" it from my house and refurbishing it. I didn't even notice it had gone – in fact we were thinking of throwing it out before we move house. Not anymore! It will have pride of place. It's all re-upholstered with the fantastic modern surfboard fabric; I love it. What a special gift, thank you so much.

Important voluntary situations vacant in the circuit

After several years of dedicated service, for which the Circuit is most grateful, Jay Jayasundara has stood down as Circuit Treasurer and Fiona Straszynski is shortly stepping down as Circuit Finance Officer.

We now need to replace them. The Circuit Treasurer is also a Circuit Steward but how much they get involved in day-to-day Circuit matters is up to them. You don't need to be an accountant or bookkeeper for either role – just so long as you're comfortable working with figures. Ian Pattison, who is caretaking the Treasurer role for now, and Fiona are happy to help with the handover and our Circuit Accountant is also available to help, so plenty of support is on hand.

In terms of time commitment, Jay combined being treasurer with a demanding full-time job. The work is mostly seasonal, with predictable busy times – preparing the budget or end of year accounts, for example.

Fiona says the Circuit Finance Officer role can be carried out by someone who is in part or full-time employment. On average, it takes approximately 2 hours per week. All payments are either paid by direct debit, standing order or online by bank transfer, which has cut down the time spent making payments significantly. The last couple of weeks of August and the beginning of September are the busiest, ensuring all outstanding bills and expenses claims are paid before the 31st August and then preparing the new spreadsheets for the start of the new financial year from 1st September.

We use Quickbooks accounting software which confirms the Cash Expenditure spreadsheet as being accurate and accountable. Fiona had no previous experience of Quickbooks or any training. She learned on the job and had a few phone calls with Stephen, the Circuit Accountant along the way. She says it really is not difficult and it's very satisfying seeing the reconciliation at £0.00 each month, meaning every penny has been accounted for! We appreciate that many people may be unfamiliar with Quickbooks and are happy to arrange training if required.

Filling these roles is vital to the smooth running of the Circuit. Please consider whether you might be able to take on one of them and if you need any more information, please speak to me or send a message via ask.stpauls@gmail.com and ask for a full job description to be sent to you.

If working with figures is really not for you, or you've got your hands full with other commitments already, please pray that the right people will come forward.
