Pray for those remaining in Afghanistan, those fleeing and those connected with the country around the world who will be in deep distress. We can join in prayer for all affected, that God's light might shine through the darkness.

Help those who remain in Afghanistan. Regardless of what happens in the coming days and weeks, poverty and food insecurity is still likely to be very high within the country. A significant amount of humanitarian aid has been paused in the country due to the immediate threat to safety. However, despite difficult conditions, a number of NGOs and aid agencies are still seeking to distribute essential items when they are able. You can support their work financially, as well as remembering them in prayer.

UNHCR remains on the ground in Afghanistan wherever it is safe to do so, distributing tents, hygiene kits and core relief items. You can donate to their work here: <u>https://www.unrefugees.org.uk/where-help-is-needed/afghanistan-situation/</u>
