## We must still keep Covid at bay



### **Sandra's Christmas Star Biscuits**

## Ingredients:

4 oz butter or margarine

2 oz sugar.

5 oz plain flour

2 oz fine semolina

pinch salt

1/2 tsp cinnamon



Preheat oven to Gas 3, or 160C

Cream fat and sugar together then stir in the dry ingredients.

Knead together lightly then roll out to ¼ inch thick on a floured board.

Cut out using a star or other Christmas cutter.

Prick with a fork.

Bake on a lightly greased tray for 15 - 20 minutes, until pale golden.

Can be decorated either by sprinkling with castor sugar before baking, or allow to cool and decorate as you wish with glace icing, silver balls etc.
