Dear friends,

Since arriving in this Circuit in October I am gradually beginning to feel at home; thank you all for being so welcoming. It can be strange to live an itinerant life. I always thought that I would stay in Cornwall. My family have lived and worked in the small village of Port Isaac in North Cornwall for generations. A lot of my family were and still are fisherman. I was reading Psalm 62 this week and it reminded me of the sea and how we can sometimes feel that we are being tossed about in the waves of life.

Psalm 62: 5-8 reads:

Yes, my soul, find rest in God; my hope comes from him. Truly he is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress; I will not be shaken. My salvation and my honour depend on God; he is my mighty rock, my refuge. Trust in him at all times, you people; pour out your hearts to him, for God is our refuge.



I'd like to share with you one of my favourite pictures by the artist Katsushika Hokusai (1760-1849). The picture depicts an enormous wave threatening three small boats. However, the boats do not appear to be sinking. The people in them are working together to ride the wave. To me this

image sums up beautifully how we should be trying to live out our Christian lives. To be in the waves, we have to first leave the safety of the harbour! This can be a scary proposition and one we may feel ill equipped for. We are all able to let God work in and through us though.

The poet Roger Keyes wrote a poem inspired by the sayings of the artist Hokusai. I share some of the poem with you here:

It doesn't matter if you draw or write books.

It doesn't matter if you saw wood or catch fish.

It doesn't matter if you sit at home

and stare at the ants on your veranda

or the shadows of the trees and grasses in your garden.

It matters that you care.

It matters that you feel.

It matters that you notice.

It matters that life lives through you.

Contentment is life living through you.

Joy is life living through you.

Satisfaction and strength

are life living through you.

Peace is life living through you.

He says don't be afraid.

Don't be afraid.

Look, feel, let life take you by the hand.

Let life live through you.

I pray that as we each continue on our journeys through Lent and look towards the season of Easter, we will become more aware of the life of God living in and through us and others. That, being aware of this, we will be confident to step out of our comfort zones. When we encounter difficulties and the waves start crashing around us as they inevitably will, let us not be afraid but trust in God and support each other in love until this storm has passed.
